III. Approval of Minutes

IV. New Business

- A discuss was held on the “Pro’s and Con’s” related to relocating the “Police Parking Facility” to Touhy Av site. The following items were presented by Ronald E McGrath, AIA, Leed AP

Pros:

1. Potential to develop Milwaukee Av site
2. Better site grades eliminating need for retaining wall
3. More space for underground detention
4. Less utility congestion
5. No residential properties adjacent to site

6. Improve/hide appearance of reservoirs design would reduce number of overhead doors
7. More efficient site design
8. Less disturbance to Police operations during construction

Cons:

1. Will Delay construction to redesign
2. Additional cost to redesign
3. Public works will access the site frequently
4. Site lines to garage from Police Station
5. Needs additional fencing to create secure walkway for Police
6. Will need additional security gates instead of moving existing
7. Limits expansion options for reservoir
8. Increased size of facility
9. Increased construction cost

A recommendation to move forward with relocating the Police Parking Facility was made by T. Fidanza with all present agreeing.

- A discussion was held on possibly increasing, Sec. 38-3. - Fees for emergency ambulance service to a flat rate for all EMS responses. Chief Feld was asked to provide additional information in the future pertaining to this topic.
- Chief Feld informed the committee that the Village Board would be voting on an addition of Article III to Chapter 38 Emergency Services of the Village Ordinances. This addition will allow the Village to enforce a policy requiring a spiller to pay for all cost associated with the mitigation of a Hazardous Material spill, as well as, any costs that might occur during clean-up.
