### Observance of Patriot Day *Honor Lives Lost On September 11*



The President of the United States signed a Joint Resolution of Congress designating September 11 as Patriot Day. This is an observance, not a holiday. It remembers the hijacking of four civilian aircraft on

that day in 2001, the destruction of the twin towers of the World Trade Center in New York and damage to the Pentagon outside Washington DC, with huge loss of life. Patriot Day is intended to honor all those individuals who lost their lives as a result of these terrorist attacks.

The Village will observe a moment of silence on September 11th at 10:00 a.m and Niles residents are encouraged to display their American flag at home. The Village of Niles will adopt a Resolution of Remembrance at the Village Board Meeting on September 27th.

The Ground Zero Flag Tour is a display of flags signed by New York City Mayor Rudy Guiliani, NYC firefighters, and NYC police officers. Along with the flags are photos and a video shot of September 11th.

## Niles Historical Society & Museum

### *A Great Place To See Niles History!*

How would you like to meet two energetic ladies from the Niles Historical Society & Museum. Marge Berles and Marilyn Brumbach (shown in this picture) are two volunteers who have a history that is almost as interesting as much of their exhibits. Working together they have served the Village as volunteers for over 31 years!

Marge and Marilyn originally met in 1963 as members of the Art Guild. As artists, Marge worked with oil, water color, and pastel paints while Marilyn worked as a costume designer. Together they assisted with and participated in art fairs. By 1971 they incorporated as the Niles Historical & Art Society. Along with the Womans Club of Niles, they sponsored theatrical plays at local schools to help raise funds for a Niles Historical Museum. These plays happened to be stepping stones for local greats like Gloria Lind and John Bently.



As the art scene area grew regionally, Marge and Marilyn decided to focus on the Niles Historical Society and Museum as a local project of their own. Over the years, Marge and Marilyn found themselves collecting and receiving hundreds of artifacts for the Niles Historical Museum. There was just one problem, however, they were running out of locations to store the artifacts and they still needed a place to call home.

In 1985, Mayor Blase contacted them with good news - the County Sheriff building, one of the oldest buildings in the Village, was available. By 1986, the ladies saw a dream come to fruition with the grand opening of the Niles Historical Society Museum. ### Free Carbon Monoxide & Natural Gas Test *A No Cost Service for the Safety of Residents*



The Departments of Community Development and Human Services are again teaming up to offer the annual Carbon Monoxide and Natural Gas Testing Program from December through March. The Village will inspect residential furnaces and appliances at no cost to residents. An appointment is necessary.

Carbon Monoxide is a tasteless, odorless, colorless gas that can cause serious illness or death. Symptoms include dizziness, headache and nausea. Uncoated brass gas connectors are potentially dangerous and should be replaced with new stainless or plastic coated brass connectors. Inspectors will advise you if your gas connectors need to be replaced.

To schedule an appointment beginning November 18th, contact the Niles Senior Center at (847) 588-8480. All inspectors wear Village uniforms and drive marked Village cars.

### KidCare: What is it? Who is Eligible? *Health Insurance and Medical Care For Kids*


Kidcare is a health insurance plan that covers your kids while charging an amount that matches your financial situation. Any kid can afford to be healthy. But KidCare helps with health insurance and medical care for Illinois children from birth to 18 years of age who are citizens or qualified legal immigrants who could not otherwise afford medical insurance. KidCare also helps pregnant women who are residents of Illinois.

The following should help you decide if you should apply:

- It takes a few months for a decision on Kid Care coverage to be made once an application is completed.
- Coverage should begin within 15-45 days once an application is approved.
- Your KidCare income is determined by subtracting day care and child support from your income total.
- KidCare is still available for children with preexisting conditions.

You may apply for KidCare by calling 10800-226-0768 or drop by the Wheeling Township General Assistance Department for an application or to have questions answered.

### Niles Food Pantry Is Low *Food For Residents That Need A Helping Hand*



Niles Family Services maintains a small food pantry for local families who are experiencing temporary financial problems and need basic foods to get them past hard times. For the most part, these families consist of up to three to five people. Many food pantry recipients are older adults who are having difficulty making it financially from month to month.

The food pantry is stocked by generous donations from individuals, service organizations, schools, and religious institutions. There is a collection site in the Niles Senior Center located at 999 Civic Center Drive.

The pantry receives a significant amount of canned goods during the holidays that may last from one to three months. But, the pantry often runs out of food by spring, leaving the pantry without food for several months. Nonperishable food donations are appreciated all year. It would be nice to have a fully stocked pantry all year long, so Niles families can receive the help they need. If you would like to make a donation or start a food drive, call 847-588-8460.

## Avoid Mosquito Bites to Avoid Infection

### Learn How to Protect Yourself When Outdoors




Human illness from West Nile virus is rare, even in areas where the virus has been reported. The chance that any one person is going to become ill from a mosquito bite is low.

You can further reduce your chances of becoming ill by protecting yourself from mosquito bites. To avoid mosquito bites:

- Apply insect repellent containing DEET (N,N-diethyl-meta-toluamide) when you're outdoors. For more information, see "Using Insect Repellent Safely" from the EPA at <http://www.epa.gov/pesticides/citizens/insectrp.htm>. At this site, learn what you need to know about repellents, insecticides, and more.

- Avoid applying repellent to children less than 2 years old. Use care in applying repellent to small children, and don't put repellent on their hands because it may get into their mouth or eyes and cause irritation.
- Read and follow the product directions whenever you use insect repellent.
- Wearing long-sleeved clothes and long pants treated with repellent will further reduce your risk, as will staying indoors during peak mosquito feeding hours (dusk until dawn).

### Annual Halloween Party

#### A Safe Place to be Scary



The Annual Halloween Party sponsored by the Village of Niles is on Thursday, October 31<sup>st</sup>. Everyone is

welcome to the party which will be open from 4:00pm to 8:00pm at St. John Brebeuf School, located at 8301 N. Harlem Ave. Niles.

The spirit behind this very fun event is to provide a safe alternative to trick or treating on the dark streets during the evening hours.

With the approach of Halloween, the Niles Police Department would like to offer TIPS for parents/guardians to reduce potential threats such as Child Abduction:

- Inform the children not to ride in a stranger's car. Children should

never approach a vehicle that is occupied by a stranger, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. If a stranger asks a child for directions or assistance, the child should just run away!

- Parents should create an atmosphere at home where their children feel they can confide in them about any strange experiences. Let your children know that you believe in them and that you are there if they need your help!

- Children should not go out alone. They should always be in the company of others and instructed to tell a family member where they are or where they are going, and never take a ride with a stranger!!!

- Discuss what neighborhoods they can visit and emphasize never to go into a home or building with a stranger.

- Make sure your children know their home address, home telephone number, and how to use a telephone to contact you. Stress to your child to call you if they are in an uncomfortable situation. Especially, emphasize to never inform anyone that they are at home alone.

- Finally, make sure they are in the company of others and not alone at malls, movies, arcades, parks, etc. And, do not forget to remind them of STRANGER DANGER!!

Parents, please call the Niles Police Department if you feel something has occurred out of the ordinary involving your children. We are here to protect and serve you!



## Refuse Collection Guidelines Plastic Bags or 35 Gallon Cans



Residents receive unlimited garbage collection on their scheduled pickup day. **Cans cannot exceed 35 gallons.** Please place trash in heavy duty garbage bags and not in the small grocery store bags used for groceries.

Residents may place one bulk item out for collection on their pickup day. Bulk Items include, but are not limited to, pianos, beds, box springs, mattresses, sofas, furniture, furnishings, fixtures, and White Goods.

*Carpet* must be cut into 4 foot lengths, and rolled no more than 18 inches in diameter.

*White Goods* include, but are not limited to, stoves, ovens, washing machines, dryers, air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, water softeners, water heaters, trash compactors, and dishwashers.

Note: Groot requests that residents call them at 1-800-244-1977 in advance for all white goods placed out for collection.

Garbage is collected once a week and should be placed at the curb or in the alley no earlier than 5:00 p.m. the night before. Call Groot at 1-800-244-1977 if you need to know your specific pickup day.

Hours of collection are 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Collection is **not** provided on the following holidays: New Years Day, Labor Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day.

If one of these holidays fall on your scheduled pickup day, collection is made the very next day. All pickups for the remainder of the week will also occur one day later.

## CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS

Residents with waste such as earth, sod, rocks, concrete, rubble, waste from remodeling, construction and demolition of buildings, excavations and other similar materials should contact Groot for a special pickup. Residents may order a dumpster.

## ITEMS NOT COLLECTED

Illinois law prohibits the disposal of certain waste in landfills. The following will not be collected by Groot: automobile tires, automobile batteries, explosives and volatile waste, flammable waste, gasoline, motor oil, and similar automobile fluids, toxic and hazardous waste, acids and poisons, unhardened paint.

To dispose of these items, call the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County at 296-9205.

## 2002 Leaf Pickup



Leaf pickup runs from mid-October through November, and is provided every other week according to the following:

**EAST OF MILWAUKEE AVENUE,** pickup begins on Mondays and continues through that week. Place leaves on the curb the appropriate Monday for pickup during the week. Leaf pickup begins on the following

dates: October 7th & October 21st,

November 4th & November 18th.

**WEST OF MILWAUKEE AVENUE,** pickup begins on Mondays and continues through that week. Place leaves on the curb the appropriate Monday for pickup during the week. Leaf pickup begins on the following dates: October 14th & October 28th, November 12<sup>th</sup> (Monday is a Holiday)

Leaves should be raked into the curb by Monday of the pickup week and be free of foreign materials such as grass, branches, plants and rocks. Leaves will not be collected if they are placed in plastic bags or boxes - all leaves must be loose and on the curb. **Leaves placed for pickup on the appropriate Monday morning will be picked up during that week, not necessarily that Monday.**

To provide the leaf collection equipment better access, residents are encouraged to park vehicles in garages or driveways. Residents choosing to bag their leaves may purchase yard waste stickers (\$1.00 each), and place the sticker on the paper yard waste bag or a **35 gallon** garbage can used for disposal. The container should be placed at the curb for collection on the regularly scheduled garbage day.

## Garbage Must Be In Proper Container 32 Gallons or Less Required at the Curb

This article is to inform residents with Village refuse service about an important issue regarding the **size limit of refuse containers**. (Nordica Townhomes, Washington Street Townhomes, and Lyons Townhomes excluded).

The Village's refuse collection contract with Groot requires garbage containers be **no larger than 32-gallons**. Garbage containers that are 35-gallons are not recommended, but will not be rejected at the curb.

An increasing number of residents from single-family homes in the Village have been purchasing 44-gallon and 45-gallon garbage cans (and large refuse carts) from area stores. However, these oversized containers are too large and often too heavy for safe collection at the curb. The personnel lifting the larger garbage cans are suffering from an increasing number of lifting injuries, which indirectly increases the cost of collection.

Also, some residents have been purchasing 50-gallon and 65-gallon carts from area stores that must be serviced with special hydraulic lifting systems. Unfortunately, these carts are not properly designed and/or are of too poor quality and often break. This is dangerous for the personnel collecting garbage and also frustrating for the resident returning home to a broken cart.

Residents may rent a "heavy-duty" 65-gallon cart from Groot Recycling and Waste Services for **\$2.25 per month**. If the container were to be damaged, Groot will replace it at no charge to the resident. These heavy-duty carts are specially made for the hydraulic lifts on Groot garbage trucks. To order a Groot 65-gallon cart, call 1-800-244-1977.

*Section 14-39 of Village Code simply states, "Responsibility for the removal of excreta. Every animal owner shall be*

responsible for removal and sanitary disposal of any excreta deposited by his animal. When accompanying the animal outside their premises, the owner shall have on their person suitable means for the removal of such excreta." Please pick up after your dog.
