A Message From Mayor Nicholas B. Blase

Residents will be voting on a very important referendum this March 19th for the purpose of improving the Village's 911 emergency telephone system.

The referendum question, which is located on the last page of the ballot, is written verbatim above.

The referendum this March 19th simply poses the question of whether the Village of Niles should increase its monthly 911 surcharge by 50 cents to improve the Village's 911 emergency telephone system. This surcharge is collected monthly and is only charged for each telephone number in your home. A "statutory accounting charge" of 3% or 4.5 cents per telephone number per month is paid to the telephone company for administering the collection of the 911 surcharge. This referendum excludes all cell phones.

Currently, about half of the Village's 911 Emergency Fund is subsidized by property taxes and not by the 911 surcharge. This proposed surcharge increase would help alleviate the reliance on property taxes.

Lincoln Couch Arrives at Village Fountain

"Don't Just Sit There - Do Something!"

The very popular Lincoln Couch from the *Suite Home Chicago* Art Exhibit will be exhibited at the Village of Niles Water Fountain on April 22, 2002. This is the date that the water fountain is to be switched on for the season. Residents and visitors will have the opportunity to take pictures with the Lincoln Couch.



The Lincoln Couch was exhibited at the Illinois Bureau of Tourism in Chicago during the *Suite Home Chicago* Art Exhibit held throughout Chicago in 2001. *Suite Home Chicago* was Chicago's sequel to the very popular *Cows On Parade*.

Over 300 individual works of art in the form of sofas, chairs, ottomans, and television sets were exhibited on parkways and plazas throughout the City of Chicago. These original artworks were created on fiberglass forms by local artists. The Lincoln couch, titled "Don't Just Sit There - Do Something", was sponsored by the Illinois Bureau of Tourism and the artist is unknown.

AT&T Cable Transfer *"Family Owned Comcast Cable Buys AT&T Broadband"*

As you may have learned from your local news, the Village's franchised cable service provider, AT&T Broadband Cable, announced in December that it will merge with Comcast Corporation to create a new cable company called AT&T Comcast Corporation. AT&T Broadband Cable services in the Village of Niles consists of cable t.v., local telephone, and high-speed Internet.

It is not anticipated that cable services, lineups, and rates will change in the immediate future due to this transfer from AT&T Broadband to Comcast. Overall, however, analysts believe that there is hope that customer service will improve with the transfer due to Comcast's reputation as a "family owned" business with quality customer service. Additionally, the new company anticipates to deploy new broadband applications such as video on demand and interactive television.

The Village cable franchise was first held by Cablevision of Chicago from 1981 to 1995 when it was transferred to Continental Cablevision. Continental Cablevision then held the franchise until 1996 when it was acquired by MediaOne. TCI gained control of MediaOne's franchise in 1997, and in 1999, AT&T Broadband attained the franchise.

Stressed Out Lately?

Learn To Stop Stress Before It Hurts

Stress! We all live with it. Yet did you know that there are easy ways to stop stress before it causes harm to your body, mind, and spirit? A hyperactive immune system, for example, may lead to the development of an autoimmune disease such as arthritis or asthma. With a depleted immune system, the body is at risk of being overwhelmed by invading bacteria and viruses, resulting in cancer or other life-threatening diseases.

While no one is immune to age related changes, there are some smart steps to make stress work for you by controlling your body's response. In other words, Stress can be viewed as a challenge as you take positive steps to get in control- and a sense of control is necessary for a balanced healthy life. What are the proactive steps you can take?

1. Recognize warning signs. Stress symptoms vary greatly from one person to the next, but the most universal sign of stress is a feeling of being pressured or overwhelmed. Other symptoms include: physical complaints, problems getting along with others, changes in behavior at home, regression behavior that is not age appropriate, change in sleep patterns, communication difficulty, and impatience.
2. Realize that stress comes from your response to pressure.
3. Try coping mechanisms that work such as breathing deeply, closing one's eyes and imaging a peaceful scene, or relaxing different body parts. Exercise, gardening, walking etc. are wonderful de-stressors.

4. Look at your problems objectively. Try to control only that which is in your control. What is past is not in your control, others are not in your control etc.
5. Seek support BEFORE you feel overwhelmed.
6. Learn to say NO!
7. Maintain your regular routine.

Prepare for Severe Weather

Become familiar with the following recommended actions so that you and your family are better protected in the event of thunderstorms and tornadoes.

Thunderstorms

A Severe Thunderstorm Watch means conditions are favorable for severe thunderstorms which can produce hail, high winds, dangerous lightning, and possibly tornadoes. If you are in the watch area, keep up to date of the latest weather information.

A Severe Thunderstorm Warning means there is a severe thunderstorm in your area, producing high winds, hail, and dangerous lightning.

Here are some common safety rules:

- In open country, find a ditch or culvert and crouch down low to the ground. Cover your head with your hands for protection. Stay away from trees and tall objects!
- In homes, stay away from windows and door.
- In mobile homes or vehicles, abandon it and go to a substantial structure or place of safety. High winds can be just as destructive as a tornado.
- If in a large center, go to a predesignated shelter area. Interior halls on the lowest floors are best.

The Key to surviving severe weather is to be prepared and take immediate action when a warning is issued

Tornadoes

When severe weather threatens, and there is the possibility of tornadoes, a tornado watch will be issued.

A Tornado Watch means conditions are favorable for the development of severe thunderstorms which can produce tornadoes in and close to the watch area. If you are in the watch area, keep up to date of the latest weather information. These storms can develop rapidly so there may be occasions when advance warning is not possible.

A Tornado Warning means a tornado has been spotted or is indicated by radar. If you are in or near the path of this tornado, take immediate actions to protect life and property.

Follow these common safety rules:

- In open country, find a ditch or culvert and lay down flat. Cover your head with your hands for protection.
- In homes or small buildings, go to the basement or to a small all-interior room on the lowest floor like a hall or bathroom closet. Use heavy furniture for shelter or cover yourself with a blanket.
- In mobile homes or vehicles, abandon it then go to a substantial structure or place of safety. Never try and out run a tornado by automobile.
- If in large centers, go to a redesignated shelter area. Interior halls on the lowest floors are usually the best.

Summer Road Construction

This summer there will be a number of major road resurfacing/reconstruction projects being financed by the Illinois Department of Transportation in the Village of Niles and immediate area. The four main projects are:



- 1 Milwaukee Avenue from Howard St. to Glenview Rd.
- 2 Hart/Gross Point Rd. from Milwaukee Ave. to Lehigh Ave.
- 3 Touhy Ave. from Central Ave. to the Edens Expressway
- 4 Lehigh Ave. from Oakton St. to Central (Chicago)

The Milwaukee project is scheduled to start March 1st and be completed by the end of August. It is important to note that all businesses will remain open during construction. Special entrance signs into businesses along Milwaukee Avenue will be provided during the reconstruction. Over 36,800 motorists use Milwaukee Avenue daily.

While we know this project may cause some temporary inconveniences, the physical condition of Milwaukee Avenue has deteriorated significantly and is in urgent need of reconstruction. The cooperation and understanding of all motorists is appreciated.

Branch and Landscape Pickup Begins The First Week in April

The branch pickup program runs April through September, and the Landscape pickup program runs April through December.



Branch Pickup

Residents East of Milwaukee Ave., pickup begins on the first Monday of each month and continues through that week. Residents should place their branches at the curb on the first Monday of each month for pickup during the week.

Residents West of Milwaukee Ave., pickup begins on the last Monday of each month and continues through that week. Residents should place their branches at the curb on the last Monday of each month for pickup during the week.

Landscape Pickup

Residents may place an unlimited amount of landscape waste at the curb on their regular garbage pickup day - provided that a sticker is affixed to each can, paper bag, and/or bundle.

Each can, paper bag, and/or bundle of landscape waste placed at the curb requires one (1) prepaid sticker and should not weigh more than 60 pounds. Stickers are not reusable.

Emergency Services *Village Departments Work Together To Create Disaster Agency*

It has been five months since that terrible attack on the World Trade Center and the beginning of the War on Terrorism. Since that

date, our Village Administration has taken the initiative to better protect the citizens of the Village by creating a state-of-the-art Emergency Service Disaster Agency. This agency, comprised of members from all Village Departments, has developed into an excellent public safety entity.

As good as our Emergency Service Programs may be, the private citizen may also contribute to the national fight on terrorism by using their observation skills such as:

Paying special attention to suspect areas for sabotage like Electrical Plants, Electrical Transmission Centers, Water Reservoirs, Gas Pipelines, Bridges, Tunnels, Public Safety Facilities, Financial Institutions and/or any area that could potentially create excessive disruption within our great Village.

Credit Card Fraud *Keep Your Credit and Identity Safe*

Years ago, most consumers paid cash. Today, most prefer to use their plastic credit cards.

Credit cards are convenient, no doubt about it. However, credit cards and credit card numbers can be stolen easily, with disastrous results. Within hours, thieves can purchase thousands of dollars' worth of merchandise or "borrow" large sums of cash. The unsuspecting consumer gets the bill.



Credit card companies are taking steps to make credit cards more secure. Some cards display a photograph of the card holder so criminals can't make face-to-face purchases with a stolen credit card. Most cards have holograms, secret imprints, or hidden images so thieves have a harder time making a new credit card with a stolen credit card number.

Despite these improvements, you still could become a victim of credit card fraud. Credit card companies won't make you pay for the merchandise that thieves buy. Nevertheless, it can be nerve-racking to lose a credit card or find unauthorized charges on your credit card bill. That's why it's important to protect your credit card, your credit card number, and your credit sales slip.

Is Your Home Poison Proof? *Prevention Is The Key*

Fears about home poisons are well founded. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration estimates that about three-fifths of nonfatal home poisons happen to kids under 5 years old.

Prevention is the key. Safe homes take hard work and a real awareness that one mistake could be deadly. But as caretakers of young children, the responsibility is yours. Here are some potential poisons to look out for:

Home-care and cleaning materials. Many of the following products are highly toxic and should be stored away from food products:

- Dishwasher detergents
- Laundry detergents
- Toilet-bowl cleaners
- Drain cleaners
- Aluminum siding cleaners
- Paint thinners & strippers
- Bleaches
- Ammonia
- Rust removers
- Furniture polish
- Lamp oils
- Brush cleaners

Medications. Clean out your medicine cabinet periodically and dispose of unneeded medicines by simply flushing them down the toilet. Keep the following out of sight and locked up:

- Cough and cold remedies
- Aspirin/aspirin substitutes
- Vitamin & mineral supplements
- Old medicines and herbal preparations

Personal-care products. Many personal-care products contain alcohol. A small amount can reduce blood sugar levels and endanger a child's brain. Because a child's body mass is so small, it takes only a few swallows for damage to be done.

- Cosmetics
- Nail-polish
- Rubbing alcohol
- Mouthwash
- Colognes
- Beauty aids
- Home-hair products
- Liniment
- After shave lotion
- Fingernail-polish remover

Pet-care products. Wear rubber gloves and wash off food surfaces after spraying.

- Pet medications
- Heartworm pills

Car-care products. Don't make the mistake of using car-care products such as windshield-washer solvent to clean the windows or other surfaces in your house. Watch for following:

- Radiator antifreeze
- Gas-line antifreeze
- Whitewall tire cleaner
- Windshield-washer fluid
- Brake/transmission fluid
